- **GLOW** contains over 60 dedicated courses aimed at our younger generation with courses that focus primarily on academic subjects. Also, specifically for this period, there are added COVID-19 e-learning courses made available.
- **Open Sesame** allows dependents access to a huge library of over 2,000 online courses, covering topics such as professional development to specialisms including Engineering and IT. Others have been selected for dependents, including English, interview skills, and resume writing.
- **edX** includes courses from prestigious international universities in technology, science, the humanities, finance, management, and languages, as well as industry specific content.
